HIGHLIGHTS OF TRIP: 17 Birds-of-Paradise and more!

Wilson's Bird-of-Paradise: Perhaps unsurprisingly, this species was voted bird of the trip. A memory never to be forgotten as we saw the male in full display!

Mountain Owlet-Nightjar: Great sightings of two birds during the day.

Western Crowned Pigeon: Recorded at two sites. The best sighting on Waigeo Island where a bird perched in full view for a couple of minutes for everyone to enjoy.

Red Bird-of-Paradise: A fantastic display from numerous birds and an equally amazing noise as we were all captivated at a lek site on Waigeo Island.

Western Parotia and Twelve-wired Bird-of-Paradise: The Twelve-wired BoP was our first BoP of the tour, so will always be highly memorable as it appeared out from the forest gloom at sunrise. We enjoyed numerous Parotia sightings both from hides and whilst birding in the forest, but a dancing immature male was simply fantastic!

Tour Summary

This was Wise Birding's first tour to West Papua and everyone on the tour was very pleasantly surprised at just how pain free the tour was in terms of staying in basic accommodation, the food, the overall climate and the fitness and ability required. The leeches, mosquitos and other biting insects which can deter some people from visiting this wonderful part of the world were not a major problem, accommodation was surprisingly good in the more remote locations and the food was tasty too! Of course, the humidity was uncomfortable at times and the trek to the higher camp in the Arfak Mountains was steep in places, but we managed to escape most rainfall that can so often cause difficult muddy slippery conditions.

Most Birds-of-Paradise were seen very well thanks to the invaluable local guides who have created and developed numerous blinds/hides from which to view many of the Birds-of-Paradise as well as other species. Like much forest birding, it is still tough in places but the rewards are high! Birdwatching in West Papua is on many birders' dream wish lists and rightly so, as it has some of the best birding in Indonesia.

Our tour visited four key areas:

The lowland swamp forests of **Nimbokrang and Malagufuk**, the lush mountain forests of **the Arfak Mountains** and the wonderful **island of Waigeo** and its remote offshore islands. Three of the above sites lie within the "**Bird's Head" Peninsula** or "Vogelkop" Peninsula. This is a large peninsula that makes up the northwest portion of the island of New Guinea and the main part of the province of West Papua. The fourth, Nimbokrang is further to the east of the region.

Nimbokrang

After only a five and a half hour flight from Jakarta we landed in Jayapura excited to finally be in West Papua, the home of so many Birds of Paradise and the key reason for visiting. We travelled by road for a couple of hours making a few stops en route for our first views of some of the commoner species like Blue-tailed and Rainbow Bee-eaters, Olive-backed Sunbird, Sacred Kingfisher and our first New Guinea Friarbird. We then arrived at our very comfortable accommodation at Nimbokrang, our home for the next three nights. We were exceedingly well looked after as we all enjoyed bedrooms with fans, good shared bathroom facilities, a relaxing lounge area and numerous tasty meals provided at all times of day thanks to our fabulous hosts.

Highlights in this area of humid lowland forest were many, but perhaps one of the most memorable was our very first morning as we stood in the forest waiting for the sun to rise. Whilst we waited we listened to amazing bird sounds, so unfamiliar to us all, and then right on cue at first light a male Twelve-wired Bird-of-Paradise (BoP) appeared on its display perch right above us! As the light improved we could only marvel at this amazing bird as we counted all twelve wires protruding from its tail. Then a call from our local guide alerted us to a Pale-billed Sicklebill just behind us. It perched high for all to see and we had seen our first two BoPs of the trip in just a few minutes! However, it didn't stop there. Later we took a short walk and were soon watching a blaze of scarlet in the canopy and our third BoP of the morning as a male King BoP performed for us. Time for celebratory tea and biscuits in the forest for a simply incredible morning that was hard to beat!

Other highlights from our time in Nimbokrang included a visit to a local resident's garden to see a Papuan Frogmouth on the nest, seen with great ease in contrast to the dogged perseverance of our local guides to find us a Marbled Frogmouth that finally showed well in the spotlight at night in the forest. The sight of flocks of Blyth's Hornbills flying over, our first views of the prehistoric looking Channel-billed Cuckoo, numerous Fruit Doves including the scarce Dwarf Fruit Dove, a stunning Golden Monarch by the river, seeing one of the world's smallest parrots, the Buff-faced Pygmy Parrot and of course more BoPs! Another pre-dawn walk in the forest and we waited in silence at another blind and it wasn't long before we were treated to the sight and hugely impressive sound of a young male Magnificent Riflebird. Later that morning we enjoyed the amazing spectacle of yet another BoP as a number of Lesser Birds-of-Paradise bounced around the canopy like fried eggs!!

The Arfaks

After a short flight from Jayapura we arrived in Manokwari where we met our team of local guides. We stocked up on food supplies and then headed excitedly into the mountains and experienced our first views of the truly amazing forest at dusk. We arrived at the village of Syoubri in darkness, home of our fabulous local bird guide Zeth Wonggor. The accommodation was very simple as expected, but all rooms had comfortable beds, electricity and clean western toilets. Our meals were very tasty and always full of locally grown vegetables. Our location could not be better as we were surrounded by pristine forest.

There were many, many highlights during our six night adventure in the Arfaks. For starters, the day views of both Mountain Owlet-nightjar and Feline Owlet-nightjar were highly memorable as were visiting the numerous hides set up by the local people to see the many BoPs. The Magnificent Bird-of-Paradise hides were one of the first we visited where we enjoyed good views and some even witnessed birds mating! The Western Parotia hide was equally impressive with very close views of adult males and females and even a young male dancing for some of the group! A female Black Sicklebill also visiting the hide was a bonus. The trek to the amazing high altitude forest and infamous German Camp was a standalone highlight and even the heavy rain even added to the experience! Once again, the accommodation here was surprisingly good and fine for just one night and we were catered for brilliantly. The birding here was frustrating at times, but with perseverance it was always rewarding. The amazing sight and resonating call of a male black Sicklebill in the forest was very memorable, as were Long-tailed Paradigallas in the atmospheric mist and a all too brief male Arfak Astrapia. Other highlights included Lesser Ground Robin and more challenging species like Lesser Melampitta and Papuan Treecreeper. On our final morning we enjoyed views of Arfak Catbird, Crescent-caped Lophorina and Black-billed Sicklebill from hides. We then slowly descended the mountains where more species followed with Mountain Peltops, Blyth's Hornbills and a luminous male Masked Bowerbird. All to a backdrop of pristine forest as far as the eye could see!

<u>Malagufuk</u>

After a very welcome overnight stay in our Manokwari hotel with time for showers, washing clothes and a re-charge, we took another short flight to Sorong. The views from the plane of more untouched forest were quite heart warming.

In Sorong, we stocked up on supplies for our two night stay in Malagufuk and we even managed to find a cake shop! We then took the relatively short journey by good roads and after numerous twists and turns we finally arrived at the 4Km boardwalk, the gateway through the forest to Malagufuk Village. People from the village greeted us and quickly transported our luggage in wheelbarrows off down the boardwalk giving us time for birding just before the rain arrived. Yet again, the accommodation was a pleasant surprise, despite some drainage issues! The birding around Malagufuk was excellent, albeit rather precarious at times when on the boardwalk! The very slippery surface required a slow steady pace and we saw a great selection of birds from it during our stay. Species such as Spangled Drongo, Frilled Monarch, Emperor Fairywren, Eclectus Parrot and Papuan Babblers to name just a few!

One of the top highlights from our visit here was seeing our third species of Owletnightjar. We quietly walked a short distance off the boardwalk to the day roost site of a Wallace's Owlet-nightjar. It peered at us from its dead tree trunk and looked rather grumpy, but it was a real treat to see such a seldom seen species. In the forest near our accommodation the birding was very tough, not helped by the humid conditions, but with perseverance we managed to see some great birds. Perhaps the most memorable sightings were the clear views of King Birds-of-Paradise, a posing Wompoo Fruit Dove, Hook-billed Kingfisher (by day and night) and a Papuan Nightjar hawking for insects around our accommodation. Our final morning walk along the boardwalk allowed us another top bird for those that diverted from the boardwalk, as two Red-breasted Paradise Kingfishers perched very close to us. Simon also had good luck with two Western Crowned Pigeons from the boardwalk.

Waigeo

Part of the Raja Ampat Islands, Waigeo is located off the northwest tip of the Bird's Head Peninsula and we travelled to the island by ferry from Sorong. The journey took around 2 hours and allowed us time to see a completely different range of birds since arriving in West Papua with many very welcome seabirds. Highlights during the crossing included Streaked and Wedge-tailed Shearwater, Brown and Red-footed Booby, Red-necked Phalarope, Bulwer's Petrel and Wilson's Storm Petrel. Once on terra firma we travelled a short distance by taxi to our beachside chalets and very comfortable accommodation which was home for the final three nights of the tour.

Once again, the highlights on Waigeo were many but as expected, the stand out highlight was seeing yet another new BoP, the Wilson's Bird-of-Paradise. It is often referred to as one of the best birds on the planet. We enjoyed fabulous views from a hide where no less than 7 birds were seen including a male in full display as nearby females looked on. However, for many, the Red Birds-of-Paradise were equally impressive, if not better! We watched and listened to the simply amazing display from these incredible birds at a lekking site in the forest - a truly unforgettable memory! Aside from BoPs, other exciting birds included wonderful views of Western Crowned Pigeon perched high in the canopy in full view, a posing Palm Cockatoo, Papuan and Hooded Pittas and near island endemics like the Waigeo Shrikethrush and the impressive Hooded Butcherbird. Seeing the huge nest of a Dusky Megapode was impressive and the views of this shy bird were great. A visit by boat to the remote island of Merpati allowed some very range restricted species to be seen including Island Whistler, Arafura Fantail and Violet-necked Lory.

Waigeo was also good for some easier birding with species such as Beach Kingfisher, Pacific Reef Egret, Hooded Butcherbird, Glossy-mantled Manucode and Eclectus Parrot easily seen around our accommodation. A nearby coastal lagoon revealed Sharp-tailed Sandpiper, Grey-tailed Tattler and Pacific Golden Plover. Mammal highlights whilst visiting Waigeo included the spectacle of thousands of Geelvink Bay Flying Foxes at dusk and the endemic Waigeo Spotted Cuscus near our accommodation at night.

Our final morning was spent on the return ferry crossing to Sorong. New sightings included Sooty Tern, Pomarine Skua and Long-tailed Skua. The calm conditions also helped boost our mammal sightings with Pantropical Spotted Dolphin and Short-finned Pilot Whale. It was then time for our final internal flight back to Jakarta to connect with the international flight back to the UK and memories of an amazing tour!

We recorded a total of 264 species of bird and 7 mammals on this tour.






















Conservation Donation - Following this tour to West Papua, £250 was transferred to the Wise Birding Holiday's central conservation fund.

The following bird checklist follows the nomenclature and classification from Gill F, D Donsker & P Rasmussen (Eds). 2022. IOC World Bird List (v13.1). https://www.worldbirdnames.org/new/
The mammal checklist mostly follows the IUCN framework (Red List) but also the Global Biodiversity Information Facility (GBIF) www.gbif.org and Handbook of The Mammals of the World.

The IOC World Bird List complements three other primary world bird lists that differ slightly in their primary goals and taxonomic philosophy, i.e. The Clements Checklist of the Birds of the World, The Howard & Moore Complete Checklist of the Birds of the World, 4th Edition and HBW Alive/Bird Life International.

Total number of birds recorded: 264 species (of which 17 heard only)

NK = Nimbokrang **AK** = Arfak Mts **MF** = Malagufuk **WG** = Waigeo **MP** = Merpati island

Northern Cassowary

Casuarius unappendiculatus

A bird "rescued" from the wild was sadly seen in captivity by our accommodation in Nimbokrang (**NK**) on three days.

Collared (Red-legged) Brushturkey

Talegalla jobiensis

Heard only on three days. Around NK on the 12th & 13th and Malagufuk (MF) on the 22nd.

Dusky Megapode

Megapodius freycinet

Great views of this forest skulker on Waigeo Island (**WG**) with 2 birds on the 24th and a single bird on the 25th on the West Waigeo birding road.

Brown Quail

Synoicus ypsilophorus

A single bird seen in flight on the 11th at **NK**.

Papuan Nightjar

Eurostopodus papuensis

Single birds seen in flight by torch light on the 13th at **NK** and the 22nd from our accommodation in **MF**.

Large-tailed Nightjar

Caprimulgus macrurus

Heard only on the 13th near **NK** at the Jalan Korea Swamp Forest.

Marbled Frogmouth

Podarqus ocellatus

Perseverance paid off with great views of a single bird in torch light near **NK** at the Jalan Korea Swamp Forest.

Papuan Frogmouth

Podargus papuensis

A number of excellent sightings with birds recorded on five days at **NK**, the Arfak Mts (**AK**) and **WG**. The most memorable sighting at **NK** with a bird on the nest during the day.

Feline Owlet-nightjar

Aegotheles insignis

Fantastic day views of a bird on the 16th in the **AK** Mts Hans Papua Lorikeet Guesthouse.

Wallace's Owlet-nightjar

Aegotheles wallacii

A daytime sighting of this seldom seen species at **MF** on the 22nd.

Mountain Owlet-nightjar

Aegotheles albertisi

Two different birds on two days in the **AK** Mts both during the day on the 15th/16th.

Moustached Treeswift

Hemiprocne mystacea

A localised and highly impressive species recorded on seven days at NK, MF and WG.

Glossy Swiftlet Collocalia esculenta

A relatively common species recorded on eight days.

Mountain Swiftlet Aerodramus hirundinaceus

Recorded on the 20th in the AK Mts.

Uniform Swiftlet Aerodramus vanikorensis

A relatively common species recorded on eight days.

Papuan Spine-tailed Swift Mearnsia novaeguineae

Recorded on six days whilst at NK and MF.

Ivory-billed (Greater Black) Coucal Centropus menbeki

Heard only at **NK** on the 13th.

Black-billed (Lesser Black) Coucal Centropus bernsteini

A single bird while travelling from Jayapura to NK by Lake Sentani on the 11th.

Pacific Koel Eudynamys orientalis

Heard on six days in the **AK** Mts and **MF**.

Channel-billed Cuckoo Scythrops novaehollandiae

This hugely impressive, almost prehistoric looking and noisy species was seen very well on three days with birds recorded at **NK** on the 12th/13th and **WG** on the 24th.

White-eared Bronze Cuckoo Chrysococcyx meyerii

Heard only on two days in the **AK** Mts on the 16th and **MF** on the 22nd.

Little Bronze Cuckoo Chrysococcyx minutillus

A single bird seen on the 13th at **NK** in Jalan Korea Swamp Forest.

White-crowned Cuckoo (Koel) Cacomantis leucolophus

A single bird on the 11th whilst travelling from Jayapura to NK.

Chestnut-breasted Cuckoo Cacomantis castaneiventris

A single bird seen well in the AK Mts on the 18th.

Brush Cuckoo Cacomantis variolosus

Seen at **NK** on the 11th and heard on the 12th.

Metallic Pigeon Columba vitiensis

Seen well in the **AK** Mts on the 19th and 20th.

Spotted Dove Spilopelia chinensis

Seen on the 11th at NK.

Sultan's Cuckoo-Dove *Macropygia doreya*

Single birds at **NK** on the 13th and another in the **AK** Mts on the 19th.

Bar-tailed (Black-billed) Cuckoo-Dove Macropygia nigrirostris

Recorded on five days with sightings at **NK** and the **AK** Mts.

Great Cuckoo-Dove Reinwardtoena reinwardti

Seen well on the 15th in the AK Mts.

Stephan's Emerald Dove Chalcophaps stephani

Two birds on **WG** on the 25th along the West Waigeo birding road.

Western Crowned Pigeon

Goura cristata

Simon saw 2 birds at **MF** on the 23rd from the boardwalk. The whole group enjoyed great views of 2 perched birds on **WG** on 24th. A single bird also flushed from road on the 25th.

Wompoo Fruit Dove

Ptilinopus magnificus

Seen at **NK** on the 13th and great views at **MF** on the 22nd.

Pink-spotted Fruit Dove

Ptilinopus perlatus

Seen well at NK on the 12th at KM9 Look-out and Jalan Korea Swamp Forest on 13th.

Ornate Fruit Dove

Ptilinopus ornatus

Heard in the **AK** Mts on the 16th and then seen on the 20th.

Coroneted Fruit Dove

Ptilinopus coronulatus

Heard on the 12h at **NK** KM9 Look-out and seen by some at **MF** on the 21st.

White-bibbed (Mountain) Fruit Dove

Ptilinopus rivoli

Seen very well in the AK Mts on the 16th and 19th with 4 birds on the 19th.

Claret-breasted Fruit Dove

Ptilinopus viridis

Seen well on **WG** West Waigeo birding road with a single on 23rd and 2 birds on 24th.

Orange-bellied Fruit Dove

Ptilinopus iozonus

Seen very well on four days at NK and MF with counts of up to 4 birds.

Dwarf Fruit Dove

Ptilinopus nainus

A single bird seen very well at **NK** at the Jalan Korea Swamp Forest on the 13th was notable for the site.

Spice Imperial Pigeon

Ducula myristicivora

Up to 3 birds seen on a small islet off **WG** on our return boat trip from Merpati island (**MP**).

Pinon's Imperial Pigeon

Ducula pinon

Recorded on seven days with sightings at NK, MF and WG.

Zoe's Imperial Pigeon

Ducula zoeae

Good sightings at **NK** on two days and **WG** on one day.

Pied Imperial Pigeon

Ducula bicolor

Up to 15 birds seen on a small islet off **WG** during our return boat trip from **MP** island.

Papuan Mountain Pigeon

Gymnophaps albertisii

Seen well on six days during our time in the **AK** Mts.

Pale-vented Bush-hen

Amaurornis moluccana

A single bird at night by torch light on **WG** on the 24th whilst looking for mammals.

Pied Stilt

Himantopus leucocephalus

A single bird on **WG** on the 25th at Airport Bay.

Pacific Golden Plover

Pluvialis fulva

A group of 20+ birds on **WG** on the 25th at Airport Bay.

Eurasian Whimbrel

Numenius phaeopus

A single bird on **WG** on the 25th at Airport Bay.

Sharp-tailed Sandpiper

Calidris acuminata

An adult and a juvenile on **WG** on the 25th at Airport Bay.

Red-necked Phalarope

Phalaropus Iobatus

At least 10 birds seen from the **Sorong - Waisai ferry** on the 23rd.

Common Sandpiper

Actitis hypoleucos

Counts of 1-2 birds on four days at random sites.

Grey-tailed Tattler

Tringa brevipes

Two birds on the 25th. A single on **WG** at Airport Bay and another on a small islet off **WG** island where we watched the Spice Imperial Pigeons.

Brown Noddy

Anous stolidus

Two birds seen from the **Sorong - Waisai ferry** on the 23rd. A number of other Noddies were not seen well enough to identify to species and were simply recorded as "Brown/Black Noddy" on both outward & return ferry crossings.

Black Noddy

Angus minutus

One bird identified from photos on the **Sorong - Waisai ferry** on the 23rd. A number of other Noddies were not seen well enough to identify to species and were simply recorded as "Brown/Black Noddy" on both outward & return ferry crossings.

Greater Crested Tern

Thalasseus bergii

Counts of up to 10 birds from the Sorong - Waisai ferry (outward / return) on 23rd / 26th.

Sooty Tern

Onychoprion fuscatus

A juvenile seen well from the Waisai - Sorong ferry on the 26th.

Common Tern

Sterna hirundo

Counts of up to 10 birds from the **Sorong - Waisai ferry** (outward / return) on 23rd / 26th. Also recorded on the 14th whilst travelling and at Airport Bay on the 25th **WG**.

Whiskered Tern

Chlidonias hybrida

Singles from the **Sorong - Waisai ferry** on the 23rd and at Airport Bay **WG** on the 25th.

Pomarine Skua

Stercorarius pomarinus

Up to 3 birds from the **Waisai - Sorong ferry** on the 26th.

Long-tailed Skua

Stercorarius longicaudus

A juvenile seen well from the **Waisai - Sorong ferry** on the 26th.

Wilson's Storm Petrel

Oceanites oceanicus

Three birds from the 23rd from the **Sorong - Waisai ferry** and two on the return crossing.

Streaked Shearwater

Calonectris leucomelas

Two birds on the 23rd from the **Sorong - Waisai ferry** and a single on the 26th return.

Wedge-tailed Shearwater

Ardenna pacifica

Up to 7 birds on 23rd during the **Sorong - Waisai ferry** and 2 birds on the 26th return.

Bulwer's Petrel

Bulweria bulwerii

Counts of 6+ on the outward **Sorong - Waisai ferry** and up to 15 on the 26th return.

Great Frigatebird

Fregata minor

A juvenile on the 25th during our boat trip to **MP** island.

Lesser Frigatebird

Fregata ariel

Counts of up to 20 birds during and on our boat trip to MP island on the 25th.

Red-footed Booby

Sula sula

Counts of up to 10+ birds including some adults from the **Sorong - Waisai ferry** (outward / return) on 23rd / 26th.

Brown Booby

Sula leucogaster

Counts of 1-3 birds including some adults from the **Sorong - Waisai ferry** (outward / return) on 23rd / 26th.

Little Black Cormorant

Phalacrocorax sulcirostris

A single bird seen near **Lake Sentani** travelling from Jayapura to NK on the 11th.

Nankeen Night Heron

Nycticorax caledonicus

A single bird at dusk at **NK** at the Jalan Korea Swamp Forest on the 13th.

Striated Heron

Butorides striata

Single birds recorded on three days whilst on **WG**.

Great Egret

Ardea alba

Recorded on the 11th near Lake Sentani and on the 23rd on WG.

Little Egret

Recorded on the 11th near Lake Sentani.

Pacific Reef Heron

Egretta sacra

Pandion haliaetus

Egretta garzetta

Single birds seen very well near our accommodation on WG on the 24th and 25th.

Osprey

A single bird on the 25th on **WG** at Airport Bay.

Long-tailed Honey Buzzard

Henicopernis longicauda

This common but impressive raptor was seen well on at least five days with sightings from **NK** and the **AK** Mts.

Papuan Eagle (New Guinea)

Harpyopsis novaeguineae

Heard only whilst in the **AK** Mts early morning on the 18th.

Variable Goshawk

Accipiter hiogaster

A single bird seen briefly on the 11th and very well on the 13th, both at NK.

Black-mantled Goshawk

Accipiter melanochlamys

An immature bird on the 17th and adult on the 18th both in the AK Mts.

Grey-headed Goshawk

Accipiter poliocephalus

A single bird seen by some on the 11th en route to NK.

Brahminy Kite

Haliastur indus

Singles on the 11th while travelling to **NK** and again on the 12th and 23rd.

White-bellied Sea Eagle

Haliaeetus leucogaster

A single near **Sentani Lake** on 11th and another over Man Svar Island during our boat trip to **MP** island on the 25th.

Greater Sooty Owl

Tyto tenebricosa

Heard on the 16th and 18th and frustratingly glimpsed on the 19th all in the **AK** Mts.

Papuan Boobook

Ninox theomacha

Heard only in the **AK** Mts on the nights of 17th/18th and later at **MF** on the 22nd.

Blyth's Hornbill

Rhyticeros plicatus

Fantastic to enjoy so many sightings with birds recorded on nine days at **NK**, **AK**, **MF and WG**. Typical counts of 1-6, though 22+ birds at **NK** including 13 in one flock on the 13th.

Oriental Dollarbird

Eurystomus orientalis

Counts of 1-3 birds over six days with sightings at NK and MF.

Hook-billed Kingfisher

Melidora macrorrhina

Heard calling at **NK** on the 12th/13th and then seen at **MF** on the 22nd with single birds during the day and by torch at night.

Common Paradise Kingfisher

Tanysiptera galatea

Seen well at **NK** from a blind on the 14th and seen again on **WG** on the 25th.

Red-breasted Paradise Kingfisher

Tanysiptera nympha

Heard on 21st/22nd at MF and finally seen on 23rd where adult and juv. were seen well.

Shovel-billed Kookaburra

Clytoceyx rex

Heard only at **NK** on the 13th.

Rufous-bellied Kookaburra

Dacelo gaudichaud

Seen well on three days at NK, MF and WG and heard on at least two others.

Collared Kingfisher

Todiramphus chloris

A single bird at **WG** on the 25th at Airport Bay.

Beach Kingfisher

Todiramphus saurophagus

Seen very well at our accommodation on **WG** on the 24th and on the 25th at Airport Bay.

Sacred Kingfisher

Todiramphus sanctus

Recorded at NK, MF and WG. High count of up to 5 birds on the 11th.

Yellow-billed Kingfisher

Syma torotoro

Heard calling at **NK** and **WG** and finally seen very well at **MF** on the 22nd.

Papuan Dwarf Kingfisher

Cevx solitarius

Heard only as it zipped through the forest at **NK** on the 13th and **MF** on the 22nd.

Azure Kingfisher

Ceyx azureus

A single bird seen by some at **NK** on the 13th.

Blue-tailed Bee-Eater

Merops phillippinus

A couple of birds during a random stop en route from Jayapura to **NK** on the 11th.

Rainbow Bee-eater

Merops ornatus

Seen well on the 11th en route to **NK** and later at **NK** too.

Peregrine Falcon

Falco peregrinus

A single bird in the **AK** Mts on the 15th visible from our accommodation.

Palm Cockatoo

Probosciger aterrimus

Recorded at **AK** (1 on 16th), **MF**(1 & 2 on 21st/22nd) and **WG** (2 & 1 on 24th/25th).

The most memorable sighting was on **WG** on the West Wageo birding road on the 24th.

Sulphur-crested Cockatoo

Cacatua galerita

Great to see and hear this species regularly with birds recorded at NK, AK, MF and WG.

Counts of 2 - 6 birds with at least 6 birds recorded at **NK** and the **AK** Mts.

Pesquet's Parrot

Psittrichas fulgidus

Frustratingly heard calling on the 16th in the **AK** Mts but seen in flight by others!

Buff-faced Pygmy Parrot

Micropsitta pusio

Great views of 2 birds at **NK** on the 12th.

Red-breasted Pygmy Parrot

Micropsitta bruijnii

Recorded in the **AK** Mts only. After poor views on the 16th and just heard on the 19th, a bird was finally seen on the 20th.

Moluccan King Parrot

Alisterus amboinensis

Recorded on three days in **AK** Mts with up to 5 birds on the 16th. Also at **MF** on the 22nd.

Eclectus Parrot

Eclectus roratus

Recorded on a total of seven days at NK, MF and WG. High count of 6 birds at MF.

Red-cheeked Parrot

Geoffroyus geoffroyi

At **NK** on the 12th and 13th including a bird on the nest. Also on **WG** on at least one day.

Great-billed Parrot

Tanygnathus megalorynchos

Heard only at **MF** from the boardwalk on the 21st.

Brehm's Tiger Parrot

Psittacella brehmii

Two birds in the AK Mts on the 18th showed very well.

Modest Tiger Parrot

Psittacella modesta

Seen on the 17th (2 birds) and 18th (1 bird) whilst in the AK Mts.

Plum-faced Lorikeet

Oreopsittacus arfaki

Recorded only in the AK Mts with 9 birds on the 15th and heard on two other days.

Red-fronted Lorikeet

Hypocharmosyna rubronotata

A single bird seen in the **AK** Mts on the 20th.

Josephine's Lorikeet

Charmosyna josefinae

A total of 3 birds seen well in the AK Mts on the 20th.

Papuan Lorikeet

Charmosyna papou

Four birds on the 16th and others heard on the 17th. Both records from the AK Mts.

Yellow-billed Lorikeet

Neopsittacus musschenbroekii

Seen and heard during three days in the **AK** Mts with up to 25+ birds on the 17th.

Black-capped Lory

Lorius Iory

Recorded at NK on two days and MF on two days. Counts of 8+ on the 22nd at MF.

Brown Lory

Chalcopsitta duivenbodei

Counts of up to 3 birds recorded on the 11th and 12th near NK.

Black Lorv

Chalcopsitta atra

Seen very well at MF on three days with counts of between 4 - 12 birds.

Violet-necked Lory

Eos squamata

Great views of this striking Lory on **MP** island with up to 6 birds seen.

Coconut Lorikeet

Trichoglossus haematodus

A relatively common species with birds recorded at **NK**, **MF and WG** over seven days.

Large Fig Parrot

Psittaculirostris desmarestii

A single bird seen briefly on the 21st from the boardwalk at MF.

Papuan Pitta

Erythropitta macklotii

Heard on two days at **NK** and seen by Sue at **MF.** Finally seen by all on **WG** where 2 birds showed on the 24th.

Hooded Pitta Pitta sordida

Heard at **MF** on the 21st and on **WG** on the 23rd and finally seen on **WG** on the 24th where 2 birds were present.

White-eared Catbird

Ailuroedus buccoides

Two birds seen on the 23rd at MF.

Arfak Catbird

Ailuroedus arfakianus

Just heard on three days in the **AK** Mts and then finally seen very well on the 20th.

Vogelkop Bowerbird

Amblyornis inornata

Recorded on five days in the **AK** Mts. Mostly heard but at least 5 birds seen on the 19th as they actively moved through the forest.

Masked Bowerbird

Sericulus aureus

A simply resplendent male posed for everyone in the **AK** Mts on the 20th.

Fawn-breasted Bowerbird

Chlamydera cerviniventris

A number of birds seem on the 11th around NK.

Papuan Treecreeper

Cormobates placens

Two birds seen well in the **AK** Mts on the 17th near the German Camp.

Emperor Fairywren

Malurus cyanocephalus

A pair of birds seen very well from the boardwalk at **MF** on the 23rd.

White-shouldered Fairywren

Malurus alboscapulatus

Single birds recorded in the **AK** Mts on at three days.

Rufous-sided Honeyeater

Ptiloprora erythropleura

Seen well in the **AK** Mts on three days with 1-2 birds recorded each day.

Long-billed Honeyeater

Melilestes megarhynchus

Recorded on five days at NK, AK Mts and MF.

Arfak Honeyeater

Melipotes gymnops

Excellent views of numerous birds in the **AK** Mts over four days.

Plain Honeyeater

Pycnopygius ixoides

A single bird seen at **NK** on the 12th and a bird heard calling the following day at **NK**.

Marbled Honeyeater

Pycnopygius cinereus

Heard only in the **AK** Mts on the 17th.

Streak-headed Honeyeater

Pycnopygius stictocephalus

Recorded on two days at **NK** with up to 4 birds seen on the 12th.

Ruby-throated Myzomela

Myzomela eques

Two birds seen well at **NK** on the 13th.

Red Myzomela *Myzomela cruentata*

Seen on the 20th as we descended the AK Mts.

Mountain (Elphin) Myzomela Myzomela adolphinae

Seen in the AK Mts on the 15th and 16th.

Red-collared Myzomela Myzomela rosenbergii

Seen in the **AK** Mts over three days.

Meyer's Friarbird Philemon meyeri

A single bird seen well at **NK** on the 13th.

New Guinea Friarbird Philemon novaeguineae

We recorded birds on eight days at **NK**, **MF and WG** with numerous good sightings and often heard. The taxonomy of Helmeted Friarbird group is complex and could change.

Tawny-breasted Honeyeater Xanthotis flaviventer

Seen at MF on two days.

Olive Honeyeater Lichmera argentauris

A minimum of 6 birds seen on MP island on the 25th.

Mountain Honeyeater Microptilotis orientalis

Seen on two days in the AK Mts.

Mimic Honeyeater Microptilotis analogus

Recorded on at least four days at MF and WG and seen well.

Varied Honeyeater Gavicalis versicolor

Up to 4 birds seen on **MP** island on the 25th.

Cinnamon-browed Melidectes Melidectes ochromelas

Heard calling on the 17th and seen well on the 18th in the AK Mts.

Vogelkop Melidectes Melidectes leucostephes

Seen only in the **AK** Mts on four days with counts of up to 2 birds.

Ornate Melidectes Melidectes torquatus

Recorded only in the **AK** Mts on two days with a bird seen well on the 16th.

Goldenface Pachycare flavogriseum

This unmistakable species was seen in the **AK** Mts on four days.

Rusty Mouse-warbler Origma murina

Recorded on three days in the **AK** Mts and at **MF** on one day.

Mountain Mouse-warbler Origma robusta

Seen in the **AK** Mts on at least two days with the best views around the German Camp.

Vogelkop Scrubwren Aethomyias rufescens

Recorded on five days in the **AK** Mts.

Grey-green Scrubwren Aethomyias arfakianus

Recorded on three days in the **AK** Mts.

Large Scrubwren Sericornis nouhuysi

A single bird seen well in the **AK** Mts on the 17th.

Brown-breasted Gerygone

Gerygone ruficollis

Recorded on four days in the **AK** Mts.

Yellow-bellied Gerygone

Gerygone chrysogaster

Seen well at **MF** from the boardwalk on two days.

Green-backed Gerygone

Gerygone chloronota

A single bird at **NK** on the 13th with other birds probably overlooked.

Fairy Gerygone

Gerygone palpebrosa

A pair of birds showed well on **WG** along the West WG birding road.

Grey Thornbill

Acanthiza cinerea

At least 3 birds were seen well in the **AK** Mts whilst birding the road on the 19th.

Papuan Babbler

Garritornis isidorei

At least 3 birds were seen from the boardwalk at **MF** on the 21st.

Papuan Logrunner

Orthonyx novaeguineae

Heard only in the **AK** Mts on the 19th.

Mid-mountain Berrypecker

Melanocharis longicauda

Good views of a number of birds over five days in the **AK** Mts.

Fan-tailed Berrypecker

Melanocharis versteri

A single bird in the **AK** Mts on the 19th.

Spectacled Longbill

Oedistoma iliolophus

First seen at NK and then in the AK Mts on two days when seen at the nest on the 19th.

Yellow-bellied Longbill

Taxorhamphus novaeguineae

Seen at **NK** on one day by some of the group.

Tit Berrypecker

Oreocharis arfaki

Seen on two days high in the canopy in the **AK** Mts with up to 5 birds seen.

Yellow-breasted Boatbill

Machaerirhynchus flaviventer

A single bird seen at **MF** on the 21st.

Black-breasted Boatbill

Machaerirhynchus nigripectus

Recorded on four days in the AK Mts and seen very well.

White-breasted Woodswallow

Artamus leucorynchus

A single bird at **NK** on the 13th and then counts of 1-4 birds whilst on **WG** over three days and including Mios Kon Island on our return from **MP** island.

Mountain Peltops

Peltops montanus

Two birds showed very well as we descended the **AK** Mts on the 20th.

Hooded Butcherbird

Cracticus cassicus

Heard at MF and then seen on WG on the 24th and 26th.

Mottled Berryhunter

Rhagologus leucostigma

A single bird in the **AK** Mts on the 17th.

Boyer's Cuckooshrike

Coracina boyeri

Two birds seen in the **AK** Mts on the 20th and another 2 birds at **MF** on the 23rd.

Golden Cuckooshrike

Campochaera sloetii

A single bird was seen well at **NK** along the Jalan Korea Swamp road on the 13th.

Common (Slender-billed) Cicadabird

Edolisoma tenuirostre

A pair of birds seen around **NK** on the 11th.

Black Cicadabird

Edolisoma melas

Seen over two days at **NK & MF** where both male & female were recorded at each site.

Black-browed Triller

Lalage atrovirens

A minimum of 4 birds were seen at **NK** on the 12th from KM9 Look-out.

Rufous-naped Bellbird

Aleadryas rufinucha

Recorded on five days in the **AK** Mts where birds were seen well on occasions.

Black Pitohui (Shrikethrush)

Melanorectes nigrescens

Recorded on three days in the **AK** Mts with a bird seen reasonably well on the 18th.

Island Whistler

Pachycephala phaionota

A minimum of 4 birds seen well on MP island including a bird carrying nest material.

Vogelkop Whistler

Pachycephala meyeri

Up to 3 birds seen well in the **AK** Mts on the 19th whilst birding the road.

Sclater's Whistler

Pachycephala soror

Seen on two days in the **AK** Mts on the 15th and 16th.

Regent Whistler

Pachycephala schlegelii

Recorded on four days in the **AK** Mts with many birds seen very well.

Rusty Pitohui

Pseudorectes ferrugineus

Heard only along the Jalan Korea Swamp road at **NK** on the 13th.

Arafura Shrikethrush

Colluricincla megarhyncha

Seen along the boardwalk at MF on the 21st and 23rd.

Waigeo Shrikethrush

Colluricincla affinis

Recorded on **WG** on two days with counts of up to 4 birds and eventually seen very well.

Mamberamo Shrikethrush

Colluricincia obscura

Heard only on two days whilst birding **NK** Jalan Korea Swamp road and KM9 Look-out.

Northern Variable Pitohui

Pitohui kirhocephalus

A single bird in the **AK** Mts on the 20th.

Raja Ampat Pitohui

Pitohui cerviniventris

Perseverance resulted in 2 birds seen well on **WG** on 25th along West WG birding road.

Hooded Pitohui

Pitohui dichrous

Recorded on three days in the AK Mts and seen reasonably well.

Brown Oriole

Oriolus szalayi

Heard only on the 21st at **MF.**

Spangled Drongo

Dicrurus bracteatus

Single birds seen on three days at **NK and MF** and 2 birds seen on **WG**.

Willie Wagtail

Rhipidura leucophrys

Seen on at least four days. En route to NK, WG and MP island.

Northern Fantail Rhipidura rufiventris

Seen on at least four days at NK and WG.

Sooty Thicket Fantail Rhipidura threnothorax

Heard and seen by some at **NK** on the 12th and 13th.

Black Thicket Fantail Rhipidura maculipectus

Heard and seen by some at MF on the 21st and 22nd.

White-bellied Thicket Fantail Rhipidura leucothorax

Recorded on at least two days at NK with birds seen on at least one day.

Black Fantail Rhipidura atra

Seen on six days in the **AK** Mts. The male is similar to the Black Monarch in appearance.

Friendly Fantail Rhipidura albolimbata

Seen well on four days in the **AK** Mts.

Dimorphic Fantail Rhipidura brachyrhyncha

Seen on at least two days in the **AK** Mts.

Rufous-backed Fantail Rhipidura rufidorsa

Heard only in at **NK** on the 13th.

Arafura Fantail Rhipidura dryas

A total of 2 birds seen well on MP island on the 25th.

Drongo Fantail Chaetorhynchus papuensis

Heard only in the **AK** Mts on the 16th.

Black (Fan-tailed) Monarch Symposiachrus axillaris

Seen in the **AK** Mts on three days.

Spot-winged Monarch Symposiachrus guttula

At least 2 birds seen well near NK on the 12th.

Golden Monarch Carterornis chrysomela

Male and female birds seen very well at **NK** along the Jalan Korea Swamp Forest road and also on **WG**.

Ochre-collared Monarch Arses insularis

Seen by Sue at **NK** with a female seen by all at **MF** along the boardwalk.

Frilled Monarch Arses telescopthalmus

Seen well at MF on one day and WG on another two days.

Shining Flycatcher *Myiagra alecto*

Recorded on four days with birds seen at NK, MF and WG.

Brown-headed Crow Corvus fuscicapillus

Two birds were seen on **WG** in the West Waigeo Forest road.

Torresian Crow Corvus orru

Up to 2 birds seen on **WG** on the 25th along the West Waigeo Forest road.

Lesser Melampitta Melampitta lugubris

A bird showed well to some, en route to the German Camp in the **AK** Mts on the 17th.

Glossy-mantled Manucode

Manucodia ater

Single birds seen well at NK on the 12th and WG on the 24th and the 26th.

Crinkle-collared Manucode

Manucodia chalybatus

A bird visited feeders in the **AK** Mts for some of the group on the 16th.

Trumpet Manucode

Phonygammus keraudrenii

A single bird on the 15th in the **AK** Mts...

Long-tailed Paradigalla

Paradigalla carunculata

Two birds showed well in misty conditions during our trek to the German Camp in the **AK** Mts on the 17th.

Arfak Astrapia

Astrapia nigra

A near adult male with long tail streamers was seen frustratingly briefly by most of the group whilst in the **AK** Mts on the 18th.

Western Parotia

Parotia sefilata

Fabulous views from blinds and whilst birding in the **AK** Mts. Birds were recorded on four days with counts of 2 - 6 birds, including an imm. male performing its dancing display!

Crescent-caped (Vogelkop) Lophorina

Lophorina niedda

Great views on a number of occasions over four days in the **AK** Mts. on the 20th.

Sightings included imm. males, females and a stunning adult male too!

Magnificent Riflebird

Ptiloris magnificus

An immature male gave fantastic views and produced incredible sounds. Seen from a blind at **NK** on the 13th. Other birds were also heard at **MF** on two days.

Black Sicklebill

Epimachus fastosus

Seen and heard during four days in the **AK** Mts. Females visiting feeders and a male complete with long tail near the German Camp. Amazing deep resonating call also heard!

Black-billed Sicklebill

Drepanornis albertisi

Half the group got lucky with an immature male visiting feeders in the **AK** Mts on the 20th.

Pale-billed Sicklebill

Drepanornis bruijnii

A single male posed for a couple of minutes at the top of a tree perch at **NK** on the 12th.

Magnificent Bird-of-paradise

Diphyllodes magnificus

Seen very well over three days from blinds in the **AK** Mts. Males, immature males and females were seen including some courtship and even mating for some of the group!

Wilson's Bird-of-paradise

Diphyllodes respublica

One of the tour highlights was spending a couple of hours watching up to 7 birds from a blind. This included adult males in full display, immature males and females.

King Bird-of-paradise

Cicinnurus regius

A spectacular bird and vivid colour! Some excellent but partially obscured views at **NK** on the 12th of up to 3 birds. This was later eclipsed by a fabulous sighting at close range over two days at **MF** on the 21st and 22nd.

Twelve-wired Bird-of-paradise

Seleucidis melanoleucus

Our first morning of the tour at **NK** we were greeted with a sight never to be forgotten and a fantastic start to the tour! A male posed for us at dawn as we counted all 12 wires(!) and a female was also seen briefly. A female was also seen by some at **MF** on the 22nd.

Lesser Bird-of-paradise

Paradisaea minor

The "fried eggs" of the BoP world posed for us at **NK** on 13th where 6 birds bounced around the canopy. A bird also heard in the **AK** Mts on the 20th and female seen at **MF**.

Red Bird-of-paradise

Paradisaea rubra

Heard calling on the 24th on **WG** and then seen the following day. It was our final BoP of the trip and most certainly one of the most mesmerising displays as 8 birds danced around at the top of their display perch in the canopy. The sounds were pretty special too!

Smoky Robin

Peneothello cryptoleuca

Recorded only in the **AK** Mts with a bird seen on the 17th and heard on the 18th.

Slaty (Blue-Grey) Robin

Peneothello cyanus

Recorded on at least three days in the **AK** Mts with some good views.

Black-sided Robin

Poecilodryas hypoleuca

Recorded on two days on **WG** with at least 1 bird seen well by all the group.

Black-throated Robin

Plesiodryas albonotata

Recorded on two days in the **AK** Mts and its distinctive electronic high pitched call heard. A single bird did eventually show well to all.

Ashy Robin

Heteromyias albispecularis

Heard only in the **AK** Mts on the 17th.

Olive Flyrobin

Kempiella flavovirescens

At least 2 birds in the **AK** Mts **on the 19th**.

Canary Flyrobin (Papuan Flycatcher)

Devioeca papuana

Recorded on at least two days in the **AK** Mts.

Garnet Robin

Eugerygone rubra

A single bird seen in the **AK** Mts above the German Camp.

Green-backed Robin

Pachycephalopsis hattamensis

Recorded on five days in the **AK** Mts and seen well on a number of occasions.

Lesser Ground Robin

Amalocichla incerta

Heard singing during our trek to the German Camp in the **AK** Mts and then seen well on our return trip with 2 birds recorded.

Pacific Swallow

Hirundo tahitica

Recorded on six days at NK, MF and WG.

Barn Swallow

Hirundo rustica

Small numbers recorded on two days around **NK**.

Island Leaf Warbler

Phylloscopus poliocephalus

Recorded on five days around the **AK** Mts and often heard, but seen well on occasions.

Golden-headed Cisticola Cisticola exilis

Seen well on the 11th in a grassland area near NK.

Black-fronted White-eye Zosterops chrysolaemus

Recorded on three days in the **AK** Mts.

Capped White-eye Zosterops fuscicapilla

Recorded on three days in the **AK** Mts.

Metallic Starling Aplonis metallica

First recorded at NK on the 13th with 40+ birds recorded. Also seen at MF and WG.

Moluccan Starling Aplonis mysolensis

Seen on MP island only where at least 6 birds were seen well.

Yellow-faced Myna Mino dumontii

Recorded on five days at **NK and MF** with counts of up to six birds.

Golden Myna Mino anais

Recorded on three days with great views at MF.

Olive-crowned Flowerpecker Dicaeum pectorale

Seen well in the **AK** Mts on at least four days.

Red-capped Flowerpecker Dicaeum geelvinkianum

Seen well around **NK** on two days.

Black Sunbird Leptocoma aspasia

Good views of male & female at **NK** on the 12th and again whilst descending the **AK** Mts on the 20th.

Olive-backed Sunbird Cinnyris jugularis

Relatively common species recorded on six days at NK, AK, MF and WG.

Eurasian Tree Sparrow Passer montanus

Common in suitable habitat with birds recorded on at least six days often when travelling.

Streak-headed Mannikin Mayrimunia tristissima

Seen very well in a grassland area near **NK** on the 11th and 13th.

Great-billed Mannikin (Grand Munia) Lonchura grandis

Seen very well in a grassland area near **NK** on the 11th.

Hooded Mannikin Lonchura spectabilis

Seen very well in a grassland area near **NK** on the 11th.

Blue-faced Parrotfinch Erythrura trichroa

A single bird in the **AK** Mts on the 19th gave good views albeit briefly!

Grey Wagtail Motacilla cinerea

Recorded on four days at NK, AK Mts and WG.

Total number of mammals recorded: 7 species

Common Echymipera

Echymipera kalubu

Seen well at MF by Chris & Pete on the night of 21st and by Simon early on 22nd.

Northern Common Cuscus

Phalanger orientalis

Seen well at MF by Chris and Pete on the night of the 21st.

Waigeo Spotted Cuscus

Spilocuscus papuensis

Seen well by spotlight near our accommodation on WG on the evening of the 25th.

Torresian Striped Possom

Dactylopsila trivirgato

Seen well by spotlight from the boardwalk at MF by Chris and Pete on the 21st.

Short-finned Pilot Whale

Globicephala macrorhynchus

At least 6 animals seen from the Sorong - Waisai ferry on the 23rd.

Pantropical Spotted Dolphin

Stenella attenuata

At least 2 animals seen from the Waisai - Sorong ferry on the 26th.

Geelvink Bay Flying Fox

Pteropus pohlei

Literally thousands of Flying Foxes were seen leaving their roost from site as we returned from our boat trip to **MP** on the 25th and seemed to fit this species.
