### HIGHLIGHTS OF TRIP: 17 Birds-of-Paradise and more!

Wilson's Bird-of-Paradise: Perhaps unsurprisingly, this species was voted bird of the trip. A memory never to be forgotten as we saw the male in full display!
Mountain Owlet-Nightjar: Great sightings of two birds during the day.
Western Crowned Pigeon: Recorded at two sites. The best sighting on Waigeo Island where a bird perched in full view for a couple of minutes for everyone to enjoy.
Red Bird-of-Paradise: A fantastic display from numerous birds and an equally amazing noise as we were all captivated at a lek site on Waigeo Island.

**Western Parotia and Twelve-wired Bird-of-Paradise:** The Twelve-wired BoP was our first BoP of the tour, so will always be highly memorable as it appeared out from the forest gloom at sunrise. We enjoyed numerous Parotia sightings both from hides and whilst birding in the forest, but a dancing immature male was simply fantastic!

#### **Tour Summary**

This was Wise Birding's first tour to West Papua and everyone on the tour was very pleasantly surprised at just how pain free the tour was in terms of staying in basic accommodation, the food, the overall climate and the fitness and ability required. The leeches, mosquitos and other biting insects which can deter some people from visiting this wonderful part of the world were not a major problem, accommodation was surprisingly good in the more remote locations and the food was tasty too! Of course, the humidity was uncomfortable at times and the trek to the higher camp in the Arfak Mountains was steep in places, but we managed to escape most rainfall that can so often cause difficult muddy slippery conditions.

Most Birds-of-Paradise were seen very well thanks to the invaluable local guides who have created and developed numerous blinds/hides from which to view many of the Birds-of-Paradise as well as other species. Like much forest birding, it is still tough in places but the rewards are high! Birdwatching in West Papua is on many birders' dream wish lists and rightly so, as it has some of the best birding in Indonesia.

#### Our tour visited four key areas:

The lowland swamp forests of **Nimbokrang and Malagufuk**, the lush mountain forests of **the Arfak Mountains** and the wonderful **island of Waigeo** and its remote offshore islands. Three of the above sites lie within the "**Bird's Head**" **Peninsula** or "Vogelkop" Peninsula. This is a large peninsula that makes up the northwest portion of the island of New Guinea and the main part of the province of West Papua. The fourth, Nimbokrang is further to the east of the region.

#### <u>Nimbokrang</u>

After only a five and a half hour flight from Jakarta we landed in Jayapura excited to finally be in West Papua, the home of so many Birds of Paradise and the key reason for visiting. We travelled by road for a couple of hours making a few stops en route for our first views of some of the commoner species like Blue-tailed and Rainbow Bee-eaters, Olive-backed Sunbird, Sacred Kingfisher and our first New Guinea Friarbird. We then arrived at our very comfortable accommodation at Nimbokrang, our home for the next three nights. We were exceedingly well looked after as we all enjoyed bedrooms with fans, good shared bathroom facilities, a relaxing lounge area and numerous tasty meals provided at all times of day thanks to our fabulous hosts.

Highlights in this area of humid lowland forest were many, but perhaps one of the most memorable was our very first morning as we stood in the forest waiting for the sun to rise. Whilst we waited we listened to amazing bird sounds, so unfamiliar to us all, and then right on cue at first light a male Twelve-wired Bird-of-Paradise (BoP) appeared on its display perch right above us! As the light improved we could only marvel at this amazing bird as we counted all twelve wires protruding from its tail. Then a call from our local guide alerted us to a Pale-billed Sicklebill just behind us. It perched high for all to see and we had seen our first two BoPs of the trip in just a few minutes! However, it didn't stop there. Later we took a short walk and were soon watching a blaze of scarlet in the canopy and our third BoP of the morning as a male King BoP performed for us. Time for celebratory tea and biscuits in the forest for a simply incredible morning that was hard to beat!

Other highlights from our time in Nimbokrang included a visit to a local resident's garden to see a Papuan Frogmouth on the nest, seen with great ease in contrast to the dogged perseverance of our local guides to find us a Marbled Frogmouth that finally showed well in the spotlight at night in the forest. The sight of flocks of Blyth's Hornbills flying over, our first views of the prehistoric looking Channel-billed Cuckoo, numerous Fruit Doves including the scarce Dwarf Fruit Dove, a stunning Golden Monarch by the river, seeing one of the world's smallest parrots, the Buff-faced Pygmy Parrot and of course more BoPs! Another pre-dawn walk in the forest and we waited in silence at another blind and it wasn't long before we were treated to the sight and hugely impressive sound of a young male Magnificent Riflebird. Later that morning we enjoyed the amazing spectacle of yet another BoP as a number of Lesser Birds-of-Paradise bounced around the canopy like fried eggs!!

### The Arfaks

After a short flight from Jayapura we arrived in Manokwari where we met our team of local guides. We stocked up on food supplies and then headed excitedly into the mountains and experienced our first views of the truly amazing forest at dusk. We arrived at the village of Syoubri in darkness, home of our fabulous local bird guide Zeth Wonggor. The accommodation was very simple as expected, but all rooms had comfortable beds, electricity and clean western toilets. Our meals were very tasty and always full of locally grown vegetables. Our location could not be better as we were surrounded by pristine forest.

There were many, many highlights during our six night adventure in the Arfaks. For starters, the day views of both Mountain Owlet-nightjar and Feline Owlet-nightjar were highly memorable as were visiting the numerous hides set up by the local people to see the many BoPs. The Magnificent Bird-of-Paradise hides were one of the first we visited where we enjoyed good views and some even witnessed birds mating! The Western Parotia hide was equally impressive with very close views of adult males and females and even a young male dancing for some of the group! A female Black Sicklebill also visiting the hide was a bonus. The trek to the amazing high altitude forest and infamous German Camp was a standalone highlight and even the heavy rain even added to the experience! Once again, the accommodation here was surprisingly good and fine for just one night and we were catered for brilliantly. The birding here was frustrating at times, but with perseverance it was always rewarding. The amazing sight and resonating call of a male black Sicklebill in the forest was very memorable, as were Long-tailed Paradigallas in the atmospheric mist and a all too brief male Arfak Astrapia. Other highlights included Lesser Ground Robin and more challenging species like Lesser Melampitta and Papuan Treecreeper. On our final morning we enjoyed views of Arfak Catbird, Crescent-caped Lophorina and Black-billed Sicklebill from hides. We then slowly descended the mountains where more species followed with Mountain Peltops, Blyth's Hornbills and a luminous male Masked Bowerbird. All to a backdrop of pristine forest as far as the eye could see!

### <u>Malagufuk</u>

After a very welcome overnight stay in our Manokwari hotel with time for showers, washing clothes and a re-charge, we took another short flight to Sorong. The views from the plane of more untouched forest were quite heart warming.

In Sorong, we stocked up on supplies for our two night stay in Malagufuk and we even managed to find a cake shop! We then took the relatively short journey by good roads and after numerous twists and turns we finally arrived at the 4Km boardwalk, the gateway through the forest to Malagufuk Village. People from the village greeted us and quickly transported our luggage in wheelbarrows off down the boardwalk giving us time for birding just before the rain arrived. Yet again, the accommodation was a pleasant surprise, despite some drainage issues! The birding around Malagufuk was excellent, albeit rather precarious at times when on the boardwalk! The very slippery surface required a slow steady pace and we saw a great selection of birds from it during our stay. Species such as Spangled Drongo, Frilled Monarch, Emperor Fairywren, Eclectus Parrot and Papuan Babblers to name just a few!

One of the top highlights from our visit here was seeing our third species of Owletnightjar. We quietly walked a short distance off the boardwalk to the day roost site of a Wallace's Owlet-nightjar. It peered at us from its dead tree trunk and looked rather grumpy, but it was a real treat to see such a seldom seen species.

In the forest near our accommodation the birding was very tough, not helped by the humid conditions, but with perseverance we managed to see some great birds. Perhaps the most memorable sightings were the clear views of King Birds-of-Paradise, a posing Wompoo Fruit Dove, Hook-billed Kingfisher (by day and night) and a Papuan Nightjar hawking for insects around our accommodation. Our final morning walk along the boardwalk allowed us another top bird for those that diverted from the boardwalk, as two Red-breasted Paradise Kingfishers perched very close to us. Simon also had good luck with two Western Crowned Pigeons from the boardwalk.

#### <u>Waigeo</u>

Part of the Raja Ampat Islands, Waigeo is located off the northwest tip of the Bird's Head Peninsula and we travelled to the island by ferry from Sorong. The journey took around 2 hours and allowed us time to see a completely different range of birds since arriving in West Papua with many very welcome seabirds. Highlights during the crossing included Streaked and Wedge-tailed Shearwater, Brown and Red-footed Booby, Red-necked Phalarope, Bulwer's Petrel and Wilson's Storm Petrel. Once on *terra firma* we travelled a short distance by taxi to our beachside chalets and very comfortable accommodation which was home for the final three nights of the tour.

Once again, the highlights on Waigeo were many but as expected, the stand out highlight was seeing yet another new BoP, the Wilson's Bird-of-Paradise. It is often referred to as one of the best birds on the planet. We enjoyed fabulous views from a hide where no less than 7 birds were seen including a male in full display as nearby females looked on. However, for many, the Red Birds-of-Paradise were equally impressive, if not better! We watched and listened to the simply amazing display from these incredible birds at a lekking site in the forest - a truly unforgettable memory! Aside from BoPs, other exciting birds included wonderful views of Western Crowned Pigeon perched high in the canopy in full view, a posing Palm Cockatoo, Papuan and Hooded Pittas and near island endemics like the Waigeo Shrikethrush and the impressive Hooded Butcherbird. Seeing the huge nest of a Dusky Megapode was impressive and the views of this shy bird were great. A visit by boat to the remote island of Merpati allowed some very range restricted species to be seen including Island Whistler, Arafura Fantail and Violet-necked Lory. Waigeo was also good for some easier birding with species such as Beach Kingfisher, Pacific Reef Egret, Hooded Butcherbird, Glossy-mantled Manucode and Eclectus Parrot easily seen around our accommodation. A nearby coastal lagoon revealed Sharp-tailed Sandpiper, Grey-tailed Tattler and Pacific Golden Plover. Mammal highlights whilst visiting Waigeo included the spectacle of thousands of Geelvink Bay Flying Foxes at dusk and the endemic Waigeo Spotted Cuscus near our accommodation at night.

Our final morning was spent on the return ferry crossing to Sorong. New sightings included Sooty Tern, Pomarine Skua and Long-tailed Skua. The calm conditions also helped boost our mammal sightings with Pantropical Spotted Dolphin and Short-finned Pilot Whale. It was then time for our final internal flight back to Jakarta to connect with the international flight back to the UK and memories of an amazing tour!

#### We recorded a total of 264 species of bird and 7 mammals on this tour.





### Northern Cassowary

A bird "rescued" from the wild was sadly seen in captivity by our accommodation in Nimbokrang (**NK**) on three days.

## Collared (Red-legged) Brushturkey

Heard only on three days. Around NK on the 12th & 13th and Malagufuk (MF) on the 22nd.

## **Dusky Megapode**

Great views of this forest skulker on Waigeo Island (WG) with 2 birds on the 24th and a single bird on the 25th on the West Waigeo birding road.

## **Brown Quail**

A single bird seen in flight on the 11th at **NK**.

## Papuan Nightjar

Single birds seen in flight by torch light on the 13th at **NK** and the 22nd from our accommodation in MF.

## Large-tailed Nightjar

Heard only on the 13th near NK at the Jalan Korea Swamp Forest.

## Marbled Frogmouth

Perseverance paid off with great views of a single bird in torch light near **NK** at the Jalan Korea Swamp Forest.

## **Papuan Frogmouth**

A number of excellent sightings with birds recorded on five days at NK, the Arfak Mts (AK) and **WG**. The most memorable sighting at **NK** with a bird on the nest during the day.

## Feline Owlet-nightjar

Fantastic day views of a bird on the 16th in the **AK** Mts Hans Papua Lorikeet Guesthouse.

## Wallace's Owlet-nightjar

A daytime sighting of this seldom seen species at **MF** on the 22nd.

## Mountain Owlet-nightjar

Two different birds on two days in the **AK** Mts both during the day on the 15th/16th.

### Moustached Treeswift

A localised and highly impressive species recorded on seven days at NK, MF and WG.

## Arfak Astrapia

A near adult male with long tail streamers was seen frustratingly briefly by most of the group whilst in the **AK** Mts on the 18th.

### Western Parotia

Fabulous views from blinds and whilst birding in the **AK** Mts. Birds were recorded on four days with counts of 2 - 6 birds, including an imm. male performing its dancing display!

### Crescent-caped (Vogelkop) Lophorina

Great views on a number of occasions over four days in the **AK** Mts. on the 20th. Sightings included imm. males, females and a stunning adult male too!

### **Magnificent Riflebird**

An immature male gave fantastic views and produced incredible sounds. Seen from a blind at **NK** on the 13th. Other birds were also heard at **MF** on two days.

### Black Sicklebill

Seen and heard during four days in the AK Mts. Females visiting feeders and a male complete with long tail near the German Camp. Amazing deep resonating call also heard!

### Black-billed Sicklebill

Half the group got lucky with an immature male visiting feeders in the **AK** Mts on the 20th.

### Pale-billed Sicklebill

A single male posed for a couple of minutes at the top of a tree perch at **NK** on the 12th.

### Magnificent Bird-of-paradise

Seen very well over three days from blinds in the **AK** Mts. Males, immature males and females were seen including some courtship and even mating for some of the group!

### Wilson's Bird-of-paradise

One of the tour highlights was spending a couple of hours watching up to 7 birds from a blind. This included adult males in full display, immature males and females.

### King Bird-of-paradise

A spectacular bird and vivid colour! Some excellent but partially obscured views at **NK** on the 12th of up to 3 birds. This was later eclipsed by a fabulous sighting at close range over two days at **MF** on the 21st and 22nd.

### **Twelve-wired Bird-of-paradise**

Our first morning of the tour at **NK** we were greeted with a sight never to be forgotten and a fantastic start to the tour! A male posed for us at dawn as we counted all 12 wires(!) and a female was also seen briefly. A female was also seen by some at MF on the 22nd.

The "fried eggs" of the BoP world posed for us at NK on 13th where 6 birds bounced around the canopy. A bird also heard in the AK Mts on the 20th and female seen at MF.

### **Red Bird-of-paradise**

Heard calling on the 24th on WG and then seen the following day. It was our final BoP of the trip and most certainly one of the most mesmerising displays as 8 birds danced around at the top of their display perch in the canopy. The sounds were pretty special too!

Recorded on at least two days in the **AK** Mts.

### Garnet Robin

A single bird seen in the **AK** Mts above the German Camp.

### **Green-backed Robin**

Recorded on five days in the **AK** Mts and seen well on a number of occasions.

### Lesser Ground Robin

Heard singing during our trek to the German Camp in the **AK** Mts and then seen well on our return trip with 2 birds recorded.

### **Pacific Swallow**

Recorded on six days at NK, MF and WG.

### **Barn Swallow**

Small numbers recorded on two days around NK.

### **Island Leaf Warbler**

Recorded on five days around the **AK** Mts and often heard, but seen well on occasions.

Short-finned Pilot Whale Globicephala macrorhynchus At least 6 animals seen from the Sorong - Waisai ferry on the 23rd. **Pantropical Spotted Dolphin** Stenella attenuata At least 2 animals seen from the Waisai - Sorong ferry on the 26th. **Geelvink Bay Flying Fox** Pteropus pohlei Literally thousands of Flying Foxes were seen leaving their roost from site as we returned

from our boat trip to **MP** on the 25th and seemed to fit this species.
